Viruses are difficult to understand. They are not **cells**, and they not living, but we normally still consider them to be **organisms**. They're about 10,000 times smaller than **animal** cells, and they can't **reproduce** by themselves. However, once they get inside another organism's cell, they can use that cell's own machinery to make multiple **copies** of themselves. At some point, they can **burst** the cell, and all of the **new** viruses will spread out to find new cells to take over. This process **damages** our bodies and can make us feel **ill**.

- AIDS is a disease in which the immune system is weakened
- This means patients can catch infectious diseases and cancers more easily
- These diseases may then kill the patients

c) Luckily we can now treat HIV to prevent AIDS from developing, or treat AIDS itself. What are these medications called and how do they work?

- Antiretrovirals - work by stopping viruses from reproducing

4 Tobacco mosaic virus (TMV) affects plants

- a) Name two species of plants it affects
- 1) Tomato
- 2) Tobacco
- b) Discuss how TMV affects plants
- It discolours patches on the leaves, causing a 'mosaic pattern' to form.
- This prevents photosynthesis from taking place in these discoloured patches
- So overall the plant won't be able to produce enough sugars for proper growth.
- So it will start to falter or its leaves will fall off
